

The Great Thanksgiving

The first nationally celebrated Day of Thanksgiving in the US was issued by the Continental Congress in 1777. It declared that a day be set aside for the citizens of the new nation to thank God for His many blessings, to dedicate themselves anew to His service, to offer Him their thank offerings, to penitently confess their sins and acknowledge that their sin had forfeited God's favor, and to implore God's grace to forgive their sins solely for the sake of the merits and mercy of the Savior, Jesus Christ. There, not only do we confess our sins, implore God's forgiveness and mercy, and thank Him for His manifold blessings, but we also receive the riches of His grace that He lavishly and generously pours out in Christ in Word and Sacrament. By these means, He forgives our sins, strengthens us in faith and love, and feeds us to life eternal. We thank Him for these gifts in the Great Thanksgiving, then joyfully receive them anew in the Holy Eucharist. Thanks be to God!
