

Minnesota FoodShare has distributed over \$18.5 million to March Campaign participating food shelves via the Minnesota FoodShare FoodFund. 100% of donations received by Minnesota Foodshare during the March Campaign go into the FoodFund. Did you know, in 2023 the March Campaign resulted in \$11,209,763 raised by food shelves; 6,231,974 pounds of food collected; and the 2022 March Campaign results were equally impressive with \$9,818,369 raised by food shelves and 5,442,736 pounds of food collected.
