Today's Topic: The letter to the Thessalonians is the very earliest part of the New Testament. Written only about 20 years after Jesus, it contains Paul's instructions about how to live out a faithful life in response to the good news. The community at Thessalonika was a newly formed church who believed that Jesus would return during their lifetime. Only now some of their members had died before Jesus came back, and that was distressing. They also suffered persecution and the hardship of being out of step with their culture in order to be in step with the gospel. All of that is to say, that life was no easier for them than it is for us, and yet, to them, Paul wrote "give thanks in all circumstances."


STEWARDSHIP: Advent I - Luke 19:31
