

Are You a member or....

A great many people tend to equate membership in the church with Christianity. It is true the New Testament uses the word *"member"*, but in a very special way. To get to the heart of this misconception we need to understand that the New Testament speaks of a living, vital membership in the body of Christ, not just an external, nominal membership in some institution, organization, or congregation.

"For as in one body we have many members, and all the members do not have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ and individually members one of another." Romans 12: 4-5 or ***"For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many are one body, so it is with Christ"*** 1 Corinthians 12:12.

In other words, The New Testament uses the word *"member"* to describe a "functioning person. All parts of the body work together productively to achieve the purposes of Christ, the Head. In view of the meaningless-ness to which the term membership has degenerated in church life, perhaps it is high time that we speak of *"discipleship"* The Church will become strong and influential if its members become Christian disciples.

Disciple is a word applied frequently to Christians in Scriptures. Jesus said to those who believed in Him: ***"If you continue in My Word, then you are My disciples indeed; and you shall know the truth and the truth shall make you free."***

A church *"member"* may avoid too much exposure to the Word lest he or she get too involved, but a *"disciple"* will be very much involved in studying and applying the Word to their daily lives. We need many more church-related persons moving from the passive role of occasional auditors of the Word to the active role of regular students of the Word. Jesus said, ***"Who ever of you who do not forsake all that you have, cannot be My disciple."*** In the same discourse Jesus said, ***"If any one comes to Me and does not hate his father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, their own life also, He or she cannot be My disciple."*** Again Jesus used the word disciple. A disciple is a selfless follower of the Master. They are willing to put themselves out for.... to support.... and to defend the One they follow.

What a contrast between this description of a person who follows Christ in the committed and dedicated way that Jesus describes as a "disciple" and the average church "member" who caters to their own comfort, desires, whims. The church cannot hope to do its job in the world today with the easygoing, half-hearted, lukewarm, offhand, part-time sort of participation typical of most church members. We need more devoted disciples, determined to be nothing less than imitators of Christ, ***"who humbled Himself and became obedient unto death, even death on the cross."*** Philippians 2:8

"The disciple is not above His Master", said Jesus. We are called by the Holy Spirit to remember that Jesus Himself was not above washing His disciples feet. He also said, ***"In this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit, so shall you be My disciples."*** Church membership may just be hanging around or visiting the vineyard once in a while, but a disciple is productive, he or she bears much fruit. The evidence that Jesus gives that ***"By this shall all men know that you are My disciples, that if you have love for one another."*** Church members may bicker and belittle one another; but Jesus' disciples are known for their great love for one another. This cannot happen if we are not in fellowship with one another, understanding each others issues we are facing or joys we are experiencing.

Even our Lord's great commission was not to make people "members" of congregations but ***to "make disciples of all nations"*** If church membership has become dull and unexciting for you, try being a disciple. Ask God to help you burst out of the old patterns, for His heart's desire is for you to become His disciple. Learn to serve the Lord in the joy of discipleship as we move from this Lenten journey to the joyous Easter season

TREASURERS NOTE - STREET REPAIR ASSESSMENTS

The City of Minneapolis will be repairing some of the streets within the Waite Park neighborhood this summer. This project will affect both McKinley and 30th Ave. Some utility work will begin this spring with the street repairs taking place this summer. We will continue to update you as more specifics are received. Additional project information can be found at:

www.minneapolis.gov/cip/2017/WCMSP-191842.

Our assessment for this project is \$18,073.72. This is a large amount for our small congregation. We can either pay the full amount in November or December of this year without interest charges OR pay over 5 years with the assessment being added to our May & October Tax statements. While our church is tax exempt, we still pay several hundred dollars in other assessments each year. The first year street assessment will be approximately \$4,319.62 (includes 3.9% interest) divided equally between our May 2018 and October 2018 payments.

We will set up a "Street Repair" account to start saving for these costs. If anyone would like to contribute to this fund, please mark your envelope Street Repair. We have a little over a year before our first payment will be due and 1 1/2 years for the second portion. Whatever we can save will help reduce what will have to come out of our general fund. Thank you in advance for your help!

Easter is a moveable feast. Easter isn't on the same calendar date every year in the way that Christmas is always celebrated on December 25. The date for Easter each year always falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Spring equinox. And once you find the date of Easter, everything else finds its place—Good Friday and Maundy Thursday, Ash Wednesday and the Transfiguration, the Ascension of our Lord and Pentecost.

All this is a long way of saying that Easter determines everything. Easter defines everything. It orders not only the entire church year, but it orders our very lives. It defines and gives meaning to our lives, as well to the things that happen in them. And since Easter defines everything, that means it changes everything too. It redefines who we are and where we stand with God and with one another. Easter makes all things new.

Without Easter, Jesus would not be raised from the dead. Without Easter death would still reign, we would still be in our trespasses and sins, and our faith and hope would be in vain. But Jesus is raised from the dead. Easter changes everything. It makes all things new. Therefore, darkness is overcome with light, wrath with peace, fear with hope, angst with rest, sadness with joy, hatred with love, sin with righteousness, and death with life. Easter changes everything, redefines everything, determines everything. Easter makes all things new.

Thus, Easter also changes our attitude about giving. For if God gave us His own Son into death so that we will live, how will He not give us everything else we need? He will, and He does. He provides for us. He even gives us the gifts that we give back to Him for service in the church. Easter demonstrates that we have a God who loves us, a God who provides for us, a God who presses us into His service, a God who has made us new in the death and resurrection of His Son.

For when you give to the church, you pass along those things that God alone has given to you. You pass along the message to others that Easter changes everything and makes all things new, even as it has done this for you. This is not a burden, but pure joy. For God has given you a part in the administration of His kingdom. He provides for the needy through your hands. He ensures that the Gospel is preached and the Sacraments are given out through the work of your hands and in the gifts that you give. And He honors and blesses this work and generosity as it redounds to those around you.

So when you sit down on the first day of the week to make your offering to the place where Easter is proclaimed and where the gifts of Easter are given out, remember: Easter changes everything. It makes all things new. More than that: Easter has changed you and made you new. Because Jesus who was crucified for our transgressions is raised for our justification.

The Sufferings of Jesus Christ

Jesus' arrest and trial ended in an unjust verdict. Reading through this account which begins with the 'Last Supper', a variety of nasty feelings, emotions and actions can be seen. The betrayal of Judas, the denial of Peter who was His closest disciple, the false allegations and charges, the baseless witnesses, the whipping, the torture, the mockery, the humiliation and abuse suffered by Jesus is unparalleled.

Why did Jesus have to suffer so much? Why was He denied justice? Why did He remain silent? Before his arrest, huge crowds followed Him mostly to *see* the wonders He performed. To them He was more of an interesting entertainer who healed illnesses and performed miracles. Why did this miracle worker not work out a miraculous escape for Himself? By submitting to cruel treatment did He fail to prove His point? Did many in that crowd walk away disappointed that there was no spectacular escape?

Jesus *freely* surrendered Himself into the hands of His oppressors. The crowds that stood by had not been there at Gethsemane where Jesus agonized about the impending cup of suffering. That crowd did not know that Jesus pleaded with His *Abba* for whom all things were possible. The illiterate mob that mocked Jesus failed to see His deliberate surrender into the hands of his tormentors as obedience to His *Abba Father*.

With each blow and each insult inflicted on Jesus, all of heaven cringed. The same angels who joyfully proclaimed His birth became silent, helpless spectators of His death. The Father Himself endured much pain to see His sinless, spotless Son put through such a grueling experience.

What was the reason for all this submission? Why did the Father allow this injustice in His son's life? The answer to each of these questions lies in God's desperate love that longed to save you and me even though that would cost His precious Son. Jesus *willingly* went through each abuse just for you. He accepted unjust treatment for you. He was scorned, injured and broken for you. He kept silent and refused help from above for you.

Do you wonder how that helps? By enduring pain and anguish and by giving up His life, Jesus Christ became the bridge between God and man. On the cross He took the punishment for your sin and mine. He knew that there was no way you and I could reach a Holy God and decided to become the *mediator*. Through His death, He opened a door that no man can shut, one that takes you and me to a place we dare not enter on our own; the presence of God. Knowing this, is it possible to overlook the sufferings of Christ? Where would Christians be if it not for the Cross of Christ? Nowhere!

Not only in the season of Lent but always let the sufferings of Christ kindle revival in your commitment to God and fuel your passion to live the life He has given in a worthy manner. The sufferings of Christ must be etched upon a believer's heart. But for the cross of Christ there is no hope, no life and no crown.
