- The red shield dates from 1896 and serves as the trademark for the Army's social services.
- The Salvation Army provides assistance to those in need 365 days a year.
- More than 3 million people volunteer for The Salvation Army nationwide each year.
- With more than 7,600 centers of operation in almost every zip code in the United States, The Salvation Army assists well over 23 million individuals nationwide throughout the year—more than 2.9 million of those during the holiday season alone.
- About 82 percent of your donation to The Salvation Army goes directly to program funding to help people who need it most. The average charity spends 75 percent of their budget on programs, while the remaining money goes to cover overhead costs like fundraising. The Better Business Bureau mandates that charities spend at least 65 percent of total expenses on program activities.
- The Salvation Army's work in disaster relief began in 1900 in response to the devastating hurricane that destroyed Galveston, Texas and killed more than 5,000 people.
