

Only about 1/3 of Thrivent members take advantage of this benefit, which means charities lose 2/3 of the Thrivent Choice Dollars.

You must renew the distribution of your Choice Dollars every year. Your choice of a prior year does not carry over. There are two ways to direct your Choice Dollars. What is Lent?

Many Christians have heard of Lent, but do we all know what it means? Is it really just a time of giving up chocolate, alcohol or social media?

Lent is meant to be a time of repentance. These 40 days are set aside to praise and worship the Lord; to read the Bible more, and to pray more often.

Lent is the 40-day period leading up to Easter, (excluding Sundays) that starts on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday, the day before Easter.

The 40 days of Lent involve fasting, prayer, and a way to connect deeper with God. Many use the 40 days of Lent as a time of personal reflection to prepare your heart and mind for Good Friday and Easter.

What are Other Key Dates of Lent?

<u>Palm Sunday</u> is the last Sunday of Lent and begins the time of Lent known as Holy Week, the week leading up to Easter and the final days of Jesus' life. Palm Sunday marks Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem, when people welcomed Him with palm branches, recognizing Him as their King.

<u>Maundy Thursday</u> of Holy Week remembers the Last Supper, when Jesus shared a final meal with His disciples and demonstrated humility by washing their feet.

<u>Good Friday</u> is a solemn day that commemorates Jesus' crucifixion and His ultimate sacrifice for our sins. Despite its sorrowful events, it is called "Good" because of the redemption Jesus secured for us.

<u>Holy Saturday</u> is a day of quiet reflection, as we remember Jesus' time in the tomb and anticipate the joy of what's to come. Finally, <u>Easter Sunday</u> bursts forth with celebration—Jesus is alive! His resurrection offers us hope, new life, and the promise of eternity with Him.
