


Welcome to God's House!

Christmas Facts

- Each year, 25 million to 30 million real Christmas trees are sold in the United States alone. There are about 15,000 Christmas tree farms in the United States, and it usually takes between four and 15 years for trees to grow tall enough for sale.
- In the Middle Ages, Christmas celebrations were rowdy and raucous—a lot like today's Mardi Gras parties.
- When Christmas was cancelled: From 1659 to 1681, the celebration of Christmas was outlawed in Boston, and lawbreakers were fined 5 shillings.
- Christmas was declared a federal holiday in the United States on June 26, 1870.
- Poinsettia plants are named after Joel R. Poinsett, an American minister to Mexico, who brought the red-and-green plant from Mexico to America in 1828.
- The Salvation Army has been sending Santa Claus-clad donation collectors into the streets since the 1890s.
- Rudolph, "the most famous reindeer of all," was the product of Robert L. May's imagination in 1939. The copywriter wrote a poem about the reindeer to help lure customers into the Montgomery Ward department store. The retailer gave away 2.4 million copies that year.
- Construction workers started the Rockefeller Center Christmas tree tradition in 1931.


